









Wichita — The health picture at the year's end shows hospital patients were fewer and younger than the last year, as the figures on admissions and deaths which show below. In the month of December hospital admissions were fewest, and deaths were slightly more than the previous month. In January they were "easier," younger, and deaths were, it's true, the greatest, according to records of the "Admit," "Discharge," and "Deaths" statistics.

The new records at the year's end show the total hospital admissions and deaths for January, and for the first three months of the year, are as follows: There are now 4,097 patients in hospitals here; 1,068 have been admitted since the first of January. There are 1,169 deaths registered, compared with 1,327 during the same month last year. Deaths following the recent influenza epidemic have numbered 150 to 160 daily, but in recent weeks the number has decreased, though there are still about 100 daily. This means that there are only about 1,000 deaths from all causes each month in Wichita. Among the causes of death are heart disease, cancer, bronchitis, pneumonia, influenza, cerebral hemorrhage, stroke, etc. There is a marked increase in the number of deaths from heart disease, but this may be due to the increased number of people living longer and thus more likely to die from heart trouble. The leading cause of death in the city is heart disease, followed by cancer, bronchitis, stroke, pneumonia, etc. The leading cause of death for the past year was heart disease, with 373 deaths. Cancer came next with 344, while bronchitis was third with 234. Stroke, pneumonia and other diseases follow.

It is interesting to note that the death rate in Wichita is about the same as in most other cities in the country, but the death rate in the city of Wichita is higher than in the state of Kansas, but lower than in the nation. The death rate in the city of Wichita is about 16.8 per thousand, while the death rate in the state of Kansas is 16.9, and the death rate in the nation is 17.8.

It is the health department, however, one of the main factors in the health picture in the city. 

## Fish Dishes — The Easy Way

Fish dishes should make excellent summer fare during warm weather, but don't let the saying "all you can eat fish" tempt you to do so unless the right types are served. The best results require care and attention to the best methods of preparation. Here, following a choice of four fish, are four fish dishes, each prepared in a different way. The first dish, which is the easiest to prepare, is a simple baked fish. The second dish, which is a bit more elaborate, is a fish casserole. The third dish, which is a bit more difficult to prepare, is a fish pie. The fourth dish, which is the most difficult to prepare, is a fish chowder.

The popularity of fish dishes depends upon the preparation of the fish itself. If you prefer to buy a whole fish, it is important to know how to clean it before you cook it. This is done by removing the scales, the entrails, the gills, and any other objectionable parts of the fish, and then by rinsing the fish in cold water.

For many fish you will find the best preparation is to dip the fish in flour and then to fry it in the following ways: first, the fish may be fried in oil; second, the fish may be fried in butter; third, the fish may be fried in bacon fat; fourth, the fish may be fried in bacon fat.

## INDIFFERENCE—COMPLACENCY—APATHY

The Greatest Privilege of a Free Born People, is to Transmit That Freedom to Their Children

In these perilous times it is not unreasonable that our attention should be focused on the obvious dangers that threaten the peace and security of the land. But behind the obvious are dangers much more real, much more fundamental, and much more serious. In this atomic or hydrogen age, into which we have been catapulted with a suddenness so unexpected that the appalling consequences have not as yet been realized by the great mass of our people, we would be naive indeed to be blind to the seriousness of our position and the threat to our liberties from the Kremlin and its satellites. There can be little doubt that we are the prime objective of Soviet hatred, and that we are the one great world power that stands in the path of Communist aggression. We are hated because we are feared. We are feared because of our strength, our ingenuity, our production capabilities, our ideals.

Fear is usually the basis of hatred. Yet, however grave may be our dangers from without, much more serious are those dangers from within—indifference, complacency, apathy. These come from within, and have been gnawing at the vitals of our national social life for over 50 years.

Indifference to the use of the ballot on Election Day can have the result that many candidates will be elected to high office by a minority of registered or eligible voters. We see complacency in the face of corruption and national scandal. Apathy toward our



Churches is seen in the fact, that while large numbers have taken upon themselves the obligation of religion, the percentage who support the church with their prayers and with their attendance, is small.

A people that spends, as Mr. Hoover of the F.B.I. recently said, \$750.00 for pleasure for every \$1 contributed to Church purposes, have something to answer for. Speaking from the Christian standpoint, Ruskin was right when he said, "It is not that people disbelieve in Christ as that they neglect Him".

Neglect is only another phase of indifference. Any police officer knows very well that the principle cause of juvenile delinquency

is parental delinquency. And again, even in the sacred field of developing the character of our own children, indifference and apathy raise their unsightly heads. Endowed as we have been with an America based on the teachings of Christ—with a land flowing with milk and honey—we have relentlessly destroyed our forests, worn out our soil, and lowered the water gage all over the country. It is estimated by conservationists that ½ of our top soil already has gone down the gullies, into the rivers into the sea. Water has become a serious problem in many sections. The East is dotted with abandoned farms. The dust bowl is fresh in the minds of all who read and think. Yet, few seem to care, and we still go along our several ways, diligent in the pursuit of money, leisure, and luxury—tragic victims of an indifference, a complacency, and an apathy that threaten our very existence to a degree that no danger from without can ever equal.

Time is short and is running out. It behooves all of us to awaken; to cast off indifference; to supplant complacency with a realistic understanding of the facts of life no matter how agonizing they may be and to bury apathy so deep it will never rise again. In general, we should purge ourselves as a people of these insidious dangers that can destroy us if we do not first destroy them. And the time for each of us to revive eternal vigilance is NOW.
