Courtesy of the Brazel Family and SSHS -Born, c. 1888 -Died, c. Dec. 1958 -Born in Ireland, Mr. MacQuiston had lived in Darby for 38 years. -William was hired at Sun Ship c: July, 1922. and retired from Sun Ship after over 30 years of service ( post July, 1952), in the Rigging Department, 68D."

## Norman MacQuiston Sun Ship, 45 Dept Thumbnail History c:1941-1945

#### Norman MacQuiston Thumbnail History

Courtesy of the Brazel Family and SSHS: -Born: c. 1917

-Graduated from Darby High School in 1934 -After H.S. graduation, he worked at a bank and attended night school at the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School.

-He started work at Sun Ship around the time the United States entered WWII (c: Dec. 1941) and left the Yard c. 1945-46. During his time at the Yard, he was a 'Shipfitter' in 45 Department. The one photograph we found of Norman at the Yard, shows him working in Our No.4 Yard as a 'Leader' where he would have been responsible for a 'gang' of men responsible for installing steel components on board ships under construction.

-After working at Sun Ship, he wanted to have his own business and purchased a gas station (c:1946), which became Darby Esso and later Darby Exxon until 1975 when he sold the business.

-Norman passed away August 1, 1975. -Norman MacQuiston was a member of the Darby Presbyterian Church and was a also a member of the Masons, Optimists and the Darby Fire Company. -Norman's father, William MacQuiston was a longtime employee of Sun Ship including during WWII.



Norman MacQuiston, 58, of 122 S. Elm Ave., Aldan, a retired service station owner, died Friday in Fitzgerald Mercy Medical Center, Darby.

Mr. MacQuiston was born in Philadelphia and lived in Delaware County most of his life.

He owned and operated Darby Park Exxon Staton in Darby and retired in July.

He is survived by his wife, the former Kitty Judge; one daghter, Mrs. Sharon Brazel of King of Prussia and one grandchild.

The funeral will be 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Marvil Funeral Home, 1110 Main St., Darby. Burial will be in Mt. Moriah Cemetery, Yeadon.
